One Eighth Air Force Scale Fly-In

On March 22nd and 23rd, the Sun Valley Fliers hosted the One Eighth Air Force Fly-In at our Cave Buttes Recreation Area field. The weather was perfect, with warm temperatures and light winds, to the delight of 79 registered pilots who brought well over 100 aircraft to fly in the ideal conditions.

The One Eighth Air Force is one of the most well known r/c scale organizations in the country, and recently received considerable complimentary coverage in the AMA magazine, *Model Aviation*. For those of you who may have missed it, the coverage was in Stan Alexander's Radio Control Scale column in the March and April 2003 editions of the magazine.

The One Eighth Air Force's claim to fame is the group's long standing efforts to get new individuals interested in scale r/c modeling by holding two non-competitive scale fly-ins each year. These fly-ins are laid-back opportunities for anyone with an interest in scale model aircraft to participate in an inexpensive non-competitive event, using a scale or semi-scale model, and be able to rub elbows and get scale modeling information from some of the best scale builders and flyers in the country. Many of the One Eighth Air Force's core local members and officers are also members of the Sun Valley Fliers, and the March meet at the SVF felt like a homecoming event for many of the group. We were very pleased to have Frank Bigelow in attendance at the March meet, as Frank is also one of the Sun Valley Fliers' founding fathers, and after several years of living in the Payson area, Frank has moved back to the valley of the sun.

The Sun Valley Fliers members who attended this event got to see some wonderful examples of outstanding scale model aircraft. These included Mel Santmeyer's beautiful green Bee Gee Model Y, Dick Skoglund's XB-19 multi-engine transport, Max Hopkins' big P-47 Thunderbolt, Jimmy Mazurek's pretty B-25 bomber, and our own Ron Marshall's beautiful Alexander Bullet. And of course, the Sun Valley Fliers' most famous scale modeler, Kent Walters, and his immaculate US Scale Masters Championships winning SBD Dauntless dive-bomber also flew in the event. There was also a rather remarkable demo put on during the noon break on both Saturday and Sunday by the California Air Show Team involving an IMAC type aircraft and an electric powered glider. For those of you who missed it, the feature of the show was while the IMAC plane performed a hovering torque roll at the center of the runway, the glider was manually attached to a towline on the IMAC aircraft, and then the IMAC aircraft authoritatively pulled the glider up to altitude and then released it. The glider and the IMAC plane then proceeded to perform a series of formation maneuvers side-by-side. It was quite the show, and the crowd loved it.

Unfortunately there were also some crashes, and this event seemed to have more than the usual share of them. Denver's Brian O'Meara lost his Master's class model of a Japanese KI-61 "Tony" on Friday. On Saturday there were a number of most regrettable crashes including Kevin Marks' turbine powered Mig-15 due to mechanical or radio failure. The Mig-15 was destroyed following a dive into the ground from

an altitude of about 200 feet. Curtis Kitteringham, from Escondido, showed the crowd just how low a low pass could be made when you try really hard, tearing the wings off his giant scale F4U in the process, and simultaneously setting the record for the longest slide of a model airplane ever seen at the Sun Valley Fliers field. Dallas Matta's Giles 202 ARF and Tony Arand's 25-year-old built up Mosquito came together in the air and created the most spectacular mid-air collision we have seen in many years. The shards of aircraft covering & balsawood confetti fluttered down for a full two minutes.

The Sun Valley Fliers kitchen crew did an outstanding job of providing food, snacks, drinks, and continuous running commentary entertaining the pilots and the crowd on both Saturday and Sunday. Charlie Beverson, Walt Freese, Ron Thomas, Dave Eastridge, Norm Goodnuff, John Wanner and others contributed heavily of their time and effort to make the kitchen a financial success for the club. Remember, these same guys as well as Jimmy Moore, Gary Schlegel, and some others had just finished working a three-day kitchen at the Phoenix Helicopter Fly-In at our field the weekend before. President Larry Sheffield and Jay Steward were also in attendance at both the events and did a great job helping with the work. My hat's off to all the SVF members who worked at both of those events for the club.
