Masking painted areas

Ever had paint run under masking tape, giving your model a jagged edge? Me too. Then, I discovered a method of masking off those lines. First, use good quality masking tape. Go to the paint department of a home improvement store and look for high grade painters masking tape. This is a plastic backed tape with excellent edges that produce a very sharp color demarcation line.

Next, clean the area to be painted with rubbing alcohol to remove any finger prints, fuel residue, banana pudding, etc., that may be stuck on your model. Mask off the area to be painted. Make sure the edges of the tape are stuck firmly.

Then, spray the area with the same color you have hidden with the masking tape. The paint seals the edges to prevent paint from creeping under them. In the unlikely event that paint does seep under the edge, it will be the same color as the masked area and virtually invisible. When that has dried, continue painting with the desired color of the stripe or panel you have chosen. When dry, remove the tape by pulling it back against itself to lessen the chance of damaging the finish. Clean any tape residue off with alcohol and you're finished.

Protecting hinges

Petroleum jelly often has been used on pinned hinges to prevent epoxy glue from sticking to the hinge joint; however, it is difficult to get just the right amount on the hinge and to make sure the hinge is completely coated. A very cool way is to melt the petroleum jelly in a small dish such as a dessert dish (an oven safe type, of course). Use only enough to melt to a depth of about 1/6 of an inch. Fold the hinge and dip the pinned end into the melted jelly. Remove and touch the hinge to a paper towel to remove excess. In a couple seconds, the petroleum jelly cools and has penetrated the hinge. You now have a completely coated hinge joint that epoxy will not stick to.

Sun Valley Fliers Club Meeting Tuesday March 2, 2004

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm by President Howard Kennedy. There were 40 members in attendance, no guests, John Dyer was announced as a new solo pilot, but was not in attendance (shame on you John!) and no new members.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of Feb 2, 2004 were presented by Paul Steinberg and approved by the membership.

Treasurer's Report:

- Gene Peterson announced that 300 out of 363 members have renewed their membership through February
- A deadbeat membership list will be coming out soon, look for it at a flying field near you! If you find your name on it, you have a little problem.

Old Business:

- Mike Peck announced that the County will allow us to place our lock in tandem with theirs in holy matrimony on the <u>Jomax</u> gate which will eventually be locked at all times. Signage is being completed by the County and once it is only SVF members who are flying will be allowed into the Cave Buttes Recreation area.
- The Gate will have two locks, and the <u>combination</u> lock will be ours. Mike will post more information on the SVF Website as it becomes available, and will be giving members regular updates at future meetings.
- The purpose of the gate is to:
 - Discourage balloonists and off-roaders
 - Keep the dust down as noted in the previous minutes. The County is apparently being sued by the State EPA in many other locals and thus is steadfastly minimizing it's liability in this regard. Simply stated, if anyone makes dust (SVF members or not) we are history at Cave Buttes!
 - Reduce liability, many off roaders have been injured and some have been killed while exercising careless abandon. These individuals have turned around and then sued the County. Yes you read this correctly!
- Mike Peck indicated that the county is very pleased with the job we are doing thus far, and assured us that "big brother is watching" very closely!
- Road Situation: The County has indicated that they will assist in improving the road to the Field. We have been instructed that if we purchase the gravel, they will bring in the graders and spread it, creating a more suitable road to the club's gate than exists now after the re-fencing.
- A motion was made to allocate \$3,000.00 to complete the project and was approved by the membership. The motion will be taken to the Board for final approval.
- The Heli Fly-in on March 12-13-14 is coming up and help will be needed for the gate and parking. Members were reminded that the field will be closed for flying all 3 days and there will be a charge of \$3.00 per car per day
- The Gene Kidwell Memorial Electric Fun Fly is on circuit, or course that is for April 4th. Members were asked to volunteer for kitchen and parking. It promises to be a shocking and ionizing good time for all! Gene would be proud!

New Business:

- Ken Melbye reported on the Pattern Contest. It was a success once again with 26 contestants. There was \$550.00 in profit for the club. Ron Thomas was thanked for the kitchen and Ron Marshall was thanked for his expert scoring. SVF members scored very well in this competition.
- Election of Club Officers is going to take place in May to coincide with the Club's annual Auction. The old club officers will be auctioned off with proceeds to the Club's Field Improvement Fund.

Howard is not sure about whether or not he will run for President, and will carefully consider this option and report at the next meeting. Howard announced that John Neilson will throw his hat (a new flex-fit one) into the ring for the Board.

Howard announced that there are a number of events coming up:

Sun Valley Fliers Club Meeting Tuesday April 6, 2004

President Howard Kennedy called the meeting to order at 7:33 pm. There were no guests in attendance, no new solo pilots, but Dick Phillips and Doug Robinson did introduce themselves as new members. Welcome Dick and Doug to the Sun Valley Fliers! Howard noted that Mike Peck would be taking the minutes for Paul Steinberg at this meeting.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the March 2, 2004 club meeting were approved by the membership as published without a formal reading.

Treasurer's Report:

- Gene Peterson announced the "deadbeat" membership list is now out. Members who have not renewed need to do so very shortly or they will be dropped from the membership roles. Gene suggested that if you see your buddy's name on the list, give them a call or a reminder at the field to keep their membership active.
- SVF Decal kits are now available for sale at \$13 each.
- Gene reported that the electric fly-in kitchen netted \$156, the raffle netted \$30, and the entry fees resulted in a total of \$465.
- The club treasury balances were reported as follows:

Reserve Account 24,902

Old Business:

- Nominations: Howard asked if there were any nominations for club officer or Board of Director positions.
 - o Norm Goodnuff was nominated for President and agreed to run.
 - Nate D'Anna was nominated for Board member and agreed to run.
 - Rick Peterson was nominated for Board member and agreed to run.
 - John Neilson was nominated for Board member and agreed to run.

Nominations were left open for the remainder of the meeting in case someone else had a nomination to make.

- Gate Information: The new gate at Jomax road is being locked as of today, with the approval of the Flood Control District. Our combination lock must be locked in sequence (daisy-chained) with the other locks on the gate so that any one lock can be used to open the gate. The gate must be unlocked and relocked by each SVF member as they enter and leave the recreation area; the gate cannot be left unlocked while we are at the field flying, unless it is during one of our events and the gate is manned.
- Roadway Construction: A new road will be constructed from the intersection of the pavement at Jomax road and the old city gate to our gate sometime next week. The club is buying about \$3000 worth of rock to keep dust down on the new roadway, and the labor and equipment is being furnished without charge to us. Charlie Beverson was given a check by the Treasurer to order the delivery of the rock for the roadway.

 Cave Buttes Recreation Area Master Plan, Phase II: Mike Peck reported on the recent public comment meeting held by the City of Phoenix. There were 75 or more Sun Valley Fliers in attendance at the meeting, far more than any other organized group that showed up. The City showed three different conceptual master plan atternatives for comment.
 - Alternative A had our flying site relocated to the north and west with all other activities behind the field to the Southeast. There was no public golf course on this alternative.
 - Alternative B also had the flying site relocated to the northeast. However, there were 5 different other users located to the north of the field, a golf course to the west of the flying site, and five other uses to the east and southeast of the field location. This site alternative appeared to be the least desirable or workable from most members' points of view.
 - Alternative C had the flying site in its present location with other users on the north side of Jomax road, an education center/ administration building and a golf course to the west of our field location.

The Board of Directors will formalize one recommendation to present for the club to the City of Phoenix. Mike Peck will draft a letter for Howard's signature to be sent to the City.

- Safety Officer: Prior to all clubs renewing their AMA charters for 2005, each club will be required to appoint a Safety Officer for the club, and that individual will need to have e-mail capability to communicate with the AMA. The AMA Executive Council approved this change at their February 2004 meeting. The SVF will need to find a Safety Officer before next year.
- Newsletter: Howard will speak to our newsletter editor, George Brown, about getting the newsletter out sufficiently in advance so that club members will have it in hand before each club meeting. Everyone agreed it would be helpful to have a newsletter each month as it keeps the membership informed of what is going on.
- The Phoenix Helicopter Fly-in: Walt Freese reported that there were 85 registered pilots at the Helicopter Fly-in. The weather was excellent and there was a lot of great flying by the younger helicopter guys. The event was very successful, netting the SVF \$2700, and Walt wanted to specifically thank Ron

Peteric and Rich Shogren for supporting the club by manning the gate for long hours and taking in parking donations. Howard and Jay Steward also pulled parking gate duties that were much appreciated. Walt also thanked the hard work of the kitchen crew consisting of Charlie Beverson, Norm Goodnuff, Ron Thomas, and Jay Steward for all their hard work. Howard also noted that Walt had worked very hard in the kitchen and handled the money end of things in an exemplary bean-counter way. All were given a round of applause by the club.

The Gene Kidwell Memorial Electric Fun Fly: Howard reported that this event had just been completed the weekend before and was also a great success. There were 31 registered electric pilots and everyone seemed to have a good time. Howard thanked all the people who had helped him put the event on.

New Business:

- SCAT Contest: Tony Quist reported that 10 SVF members had traveled to and competed in the SCAT Contest recently held in Las Vegas, NV. Our guys did very well and brought home a considerable portion of the loot. See the SCAT website for details on the finishers. Tony also reminded the club that the SVF was holding a SCAT Contest at our field on April 24 & 25, 2004 (in three short weeks). The club will again need gate workers and kitchen help to make the event financially worthwhile. Volunteers should contact Tony Quist or Walt Freese.
- New Frequency Board: Howard thanked Charlie Beverson for the nice new all metal frequency board that Charlie fabricated, painted, and hung at the field. It is a big improvement over the old wood one, that had been vandalized, and looks great. Thank you very much, Charlie. How about some replacement frequency pins for those that have walked off?
- Elections: Howard asked the club whether they would rather have a short business meeting and the election during the May 2 club auction at the flying site, or whether most people would rather have a regular meeting with the election on the normal Tuesday, May 4th, at the Legion Hall? After some discussion, it was decided that we would rather have a regular meeting with the election on the normal Tuesday, May 4th, at the Legion Hall. Most members felt there were too many things going on at the auction to combine the two functions.
- Special Thanks: Howard asked the club to recognize and thank Charlie Beverson, Walt Freese, Jay Steward, and Ron Thomas for the significant amount of hard work those guys have been doing all year in keeping up the field and helping out with events. The club gave the boys a round of applause.
